T. Deisner now of Pewaukee in Milwaukee
County aforesaid and that her said husband
by false pretences prevailed upon this deponent
to move with him to this Country where this
deponent and husband arrived in August
last. and since the twelfth day of September
last have been residents of Milwaukee aforesaid
where this deponent lived with her said husband
until the fifth of January inst. when he the
said husband willfully and maliciously
and without cause drove this deponent from
the house of said husband without any
provision whatever for deponent's support in
which situation she since said expulsion has
been and still remains - And this deponent
further says that while living with her ^{husband} said
he did abuse and maltreat her and threatened
to kill himself. And this deponent further
states that if said husband would permit her
to return to his house. by doing so would

would endanger his life as this deponent
